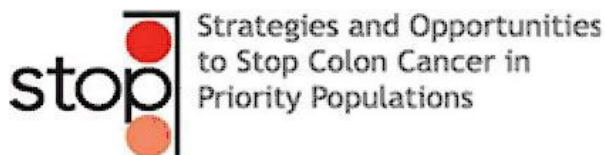
Colorectal cancer (CRC) is the second-leading cause of cancer death in the United States. Rates of CRC screening are extremely low in patients at Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), which serve nearly 19 million patients annually. We are testing an intervention to improve rates of CRC screening in a group of FQHCs, and we intend for our program to be a model for other FQHCs and health systems.

Potential Impact:

This study is expected to demonstrate the effectiveness of using mail-in CRC screening tests at increasing CRC screening rates in safety net patients. These results will inform the ability to improve these screening rates in CHCs nationwide.
